TENTATIVE ITINERARY

October 13/Day 1: With our group together we depart Michigan traveling thru Ontario into New York and our destination for the day into Auburn. Periodic stretch and meal stops will be made along our route... (D)

October 14/Day 2: After breakfast we travel to Kingston in time for lunch at the Mariner's Harbor Restaurant located on the Hudson River. We then board the Rip Van Winkle for a two hour narrated cruise passing two lighthouses and several mansions at the peak of the Fall Foliage Season on the beautiful Hudson River. Once docked, we will transfer to the majestic Mohonk Mountain House Resort to enjoy the grounds and the resort prior to dinner. Built in 1869, this grand 267-room Victorian castle is one of America's oldest family-owned resorts. Afterwards we check into the Holiday Inn – Kingston for the next two nights. (B, L, D)

October 15/Day 3: After breakfast we are greeted by our local step-on guide and depart for the Franklin D. Roosevelt National Site. We'll visit the museum, the rose garden and the burial site of the Roosevelt's. We are then on our way to the Culinary Institute of America, where we visit the museum and experience lunch at one of the award-winning, student-staffed public restaurants. This afternoon depart for the Vanderbilt Mansion – one of the finest and most intact of the lavish estates built by wealthy 19th-century industrialists along the Hudson, Frederick W. Vanderbilt's 54-room country palace in Hyde Park built in 1898, is a no-holds-barred gem.

Next we visit Locust Grove, a 150-acre Estate of Samuel F.B. Morse located on the Hudson River Poughkeepsie. Included in our visit is the Estates beautiful Italianate villa containing extensive collections of American and European decorative and fine arts. Before returning to the hotel we visit the Walkway over the Hudson. Dinner this evening is at our hotel. (B, L, D)

October 16/Day 4: After breakfast we depart for the Emerson, home of the World's Largest Kaleidoscope - the 60-foot kaleidoscope inside an old barn silo, gives visitors an opportunity to climb inside the tube of a superhuman kaleidoscope. Next it is on to the Delaware and Ulster Railroad to board the "Rip Van Winkle Flyer", the most luxurious train that is available on the east coast of the United States, providing us with a leisurely rail cruise through one of America's most picturesque mountain ranges plus a delicious lunch.

This afternoon travel to Cooperstown for our visit to the National Baseball hall of Fame and Museum. Enter the Museum and find yourself immersed in more than 150 years of baseball history, in the timeline exhibit, flash forward from the 1860's through today's achievements. Our accommodations this evening is in Oneonta, N.Y. (B,L, D)

October 17/Day 5: After breakfast we travel to LeRoy, NY for our visit to the Historic LeRoy House/Jell-O Gallery. The Jell-O Gallery explores the history, marketing and advertising of America's most famous dessert. This afternoon we arrive in Buffalo, N.Y. and our beautiful accommodations on Grand Island, the Holiday Inn Grand Island Resort.
